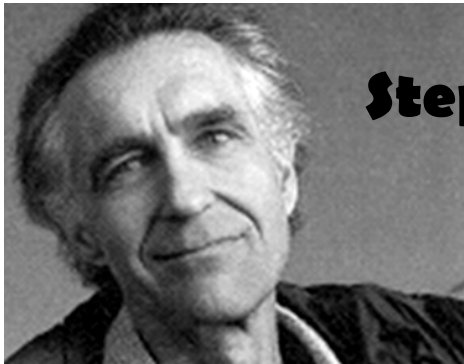


Damaged Care
